- 1) Which HSIP themes/data sets should we focus on improving? Where can we put effort into improving quality in the HSIP data product?
- 2) How do we want to measure data effectiveness and usage, particularly concerning how it impacts missions?
- 3) How do we improve the currency of HSIP data? HSIP is becoming more dynamic and moving away from annual release.
- 4) How do we improve access to HSIP data?

### 2.5.3 National Fusion Center Association (NFCA) Training Event Overview (Informational)

HIFLD had a presence at the National Fusion Center Association (NFCA) training event on November 3-5 in Alexandria, VA. At this event, HIFLD was informed by HSIN colleagues that the HIFLD two-pager is the second most downloaded artifact on the HSIN network. HIFLD will continue to partner with HSIN which is

embedded with fusion centers. In general, there was strong engagement and there are plans to attend next year.

## **2.5.4 Candidates for HIFLD Participation (Decisional)**

A number of potential partners and members for the HIFLD Subcommittee were nominated after the October Subcommittee meeting. The final list of potential partners and members was presented to the group and it was recommended that USPS be a potential voting member while the remaining nominees will be partners with no voting privileges.

Mr. Bolen motioned to approve the list and Ms. Youmans seconded the vote. The motion to invite the organizations to be partners and members of the HIFLD Subcommittee was approved. Additional nominations for organizations will continue to be accepted by the HIFLD Executive Secretariat.

## **2.6 HSIP Analysis Efforts**

### **2.6.1 Recommended Approach to Metrics/Reporting (Decisional)**

In a follow-up from the October 2015 Subcommittee meeting, metrics were discussed in further detail as well as provided in the read ahead for the meeting for decision and input from the Subcommittee. As HSIP moves forward to an online environment, current metrics will be maintained and leveraged as well as refined to help understand the usage of the data. While there is an increased focus on quantitative usage metrics, the goal is also to conduct more ad-hoc engagements to understand how HSIP is being utilized. The Executive Secretariat would like to understand where HSIP will be deployed within other organizations and their metrics on their particular usage.

Mr. Alexander emphasized there should be synergy and coordination between HIFLD/HSIP metrics and the GeoPlatform to meet portfolio management requirements for A16. He would also like consistency with the metrics being captured between public and FOUO HSIP data. He highlighted the importance of managing the data as an asset and quantifying the value of data with metrics, mentioning the Digital Government Strategy which states the types of metrics that need to be captured.

Mr. Donnelly asked if there were any objections to using the recommended metrics for HSIP. Mr. Shafernich motioned to move forward with these metrics and Ms. Liptrap seconded the vote. The motion to use the metrics discussed as a baseline with potential modifications as needed was adopted. There is a standing open call for suggestions and the list is not final.

To supplement the metrics discussion, Ms. Liptrap provided some insight on metrics used at Census and mentioned that some traditional metrics collecting methods such as reaching out to data users can be helpful. She discussed the software (Adobe Site Catalyst) that the organization uses which provides a good sense of website traffic, particularly traffic that is driven to where data is available. However, it does not reach the FTP service and therefore does not provide information regarding what data is being downloaded.

### **2.6.2 Tier One Data Enhancement (Decisional)**

Tier one data enhancement was brought up for additional discussion and decision as a follow-on from the October Subcommittee meeting. Mr. Bolen requested that the subcommittee validate and support the direction and focus of tier one data enhancement.

Mr. Bolen highlighted the need to focus on the big picture sectors as well other non-sector specific data layers such as population (Landscan) and business points data which do not fall within particular sectors but are critical to the product line as a whole. He clarified that they will be looking at the data, assessing the gaps, enriching it, and subsequently hosted. The data layers will be represented as enriched layers rather than layers that are directly from the providers but will inform the providers and share with them the enrichment efforts that were conducted.

Mr. Vaughn motioned to approve the tier one data enhancement process to move forward. Mr. Spangler seconded and the motion was approved.

There was lengthy discussion regarding the need to acquire parcel data as emphasized in the feedback session. This currently being explored and it was determined that a meeting with the FGDC Cadastral Committee will need to occur as part of this process. Mr. Alexander motioned to host a parcel workshop in summer 2016—there were no objections. In addition to parcel data, Mr. Spangler expressed the emerging importance of mapping “cyberspace key terrain” and whether or not HSIP communication layers might support what DOD is working to achieve. He recommended that there should be an increased focus on this data as there is currently a tremendous amount of focus on cyber security, and suggested having an offline discussion with the NGA team. The NGA team offered to explore this data in more depth.

## **2.7 Public Data: Re-hosting and New Capability (Decisional)**

The HSIP dissemination framework will be planned within three broad categories for simplifying data dissemination: (1) commodity; (2) government (restricted); and (3) government (none/unrestricted). Because of licensing and access restrictions for commodity and government (restricted) data, respectively, these data will be in an access controlled environment that meets security regulations. The proposed vehicle for this is an existing DHS GII capability. The third category, government (none/unrestricted) can be publicly re-hosted and options for sharing this information to improve access are being explored. However, the ArcGIS Online Open Data capability is a likely candidate for an interim capability which will transition over to the DOI GeoPlatform that will be a central access point to the data. All of the data on the Open Data site will also point to the GeoPlatform during this interim period. Ultimately, the objective is not to duplicate any data but to point to services using the “no wrong door” approach. A brief demo of the Open Data capability was provided to the group, and there were no objections to moving forward with this approach.
